Present a Paper

- Academics and researchers from both Korea and abroad are encouraged to participate and share their experiences, knowledge and research findings.
- Please send us no later than **31 March 2002** an abstract of 500 words or less, with paper presenter's name, affiliation, mailing address, phone and fax numbers, and e-mail address.
- Original papers are encouraged. But there are no restrictions on presenting a paper you may have presented elsewhere. If your paper has already presented at a conference or accepted for journal publication, please inform us at the time of submission.
- Papers will be selected through a competitive peer review. Selected papers will be informed no later than **30 April 2002**.
- If your paper is selected, please send us no later than **30 June 2002** the full paper no longer than 30 total pages inclusive. The paper should be written in English.
- If you wish to discuss a paper or chair a session, please indicate so when you send us your full paper.
- All papers presented at the conference will be considered for inclusion in the special

volume of *the Journal of the Korean Economy*, the English journal of the Association of the Korean Economic Studies.

Organize a session

- Those who want to organize their own session should send us a proposal no later than **30 April 2002**.
- The proposal must include an overview statement, a short synopsis of each presentation, and a signed statement from each participant confirming agreement to participate.
- The fee for the organizer will be waived.

Present a Paper in Workshop for Young Scholars

- Young Scholars are those who are at the final stages of Ph.D. dissertation work.
- There will be a separate workshop for young scholars.
- Please send us an abstract of 500 words or less, with paper presenter's name, mailing address, phone and fax numbers, e-mail address, the name of his/her doctoral institution and (anticipated) year of degree completion.
- Senior scholars from Korea and around the world will provide comments.
